

### A Rusty Vignette

Back in the eighteenth century, Soldierpet was a residential colony for the British army. Old Town went on to become home to the Anglo-Indian community in Vizag and, even to this day, resembles the backyards of Great Britain.

And then, when the French missionaries landed on these shores around the middle of the nineteenth century, they too left their indelible mark on the area-schools with a cosmopolitan je ne sais quoi (St Aloysius, St John's, Queen Mary's, etc.) sprang up, along with magnificent churches. (St John's Church was designed by no less a personage than the legendary Sir Arthur Cotton, the civil engineer who designed the Godavari barrage.)

The locale attracted a variety of communities and became a lively mix of Anglo-Indians, French missionaries, Bengali wage workers and fisherfolk, not to forget the fiery, moneylending Kabuliwalas (the Shylocks of One Town).

The neighbourhood still has listed heritage buildings like the Town Hall and the Freemasons' Hall that lend a certain grandeur to the area. In addition, Soldierpet includes the fishing harbour, a bus depot, cinemas, a reading room and various government offices-most of them ramshackle and run down now, their peeling paintwork perennially smothered with the red dust belched by the overhead iron-ore belt, lending a surreal, roseate glow over the whole area.

Every Sunday, like clockwork, we motored through the winding lanes of Old Town to church. This locality is etched into my memory with the magic of fairy lights, the singing of the choirs and the fishy fragrances of the incoming tides.

Our Sundays invariably held a festive air of breathless and joyful anticipation. We were always getting ready for some celebration or other-Easter, Thanksgiving, Annual Fête, Christmas, New Year. The run up to each of these was just as exhilarating and exciting as the very day of the festival.

#### The Annual Fête

Held in the churchyard of St John's Church, the annual fête held the ambience of a rustic, village market with its food stalls, games kiosks, the resplendent merry-go-rounds and a carnival wheel.

Several weeks in advance, the parishioners would be flung into a flurry of activity, making posters and banners, arranging for a mind-boggling array of delicious food and putting up stalls. The younger lot was herded into the parsonage and set to making strings of bunting to ensure that they-the kids not the bunting-weren't accidentally trampled underfoot.

We've even had music with a live band at times and people could request a song ... for a song (lol!)-like the jukeboxes of yore.

#### Choir

Being corralled into the choir was an adventure in itself.

Treacherous parents, only too happy to get us out of their hair, colluded with the organist and the padre, and before long, a hapless bunch of us found ourselves doing the interminable and incessant scales:

darkly muttering about the unfairness of it all as we watched the blessed ones, those sly creatures who had managed to evade the choir master's long arm, blithely wave goodbye to those of us who had to stay behind for choir practice.

The bonds built by commiseration among the choristers, not unlike the bonds between the inmates of Guantanamo Bay, have withstood the passage of time.

We were segregated into the four parts of the harmony: soprano, alto, tenor and bass. This 'segregation' was done by mysterious and mystical forces beyond our comprehension, with the soprano in the front row, the bass right at the back and the rest of us heaped willy-nilly in the middle as alto and tenor.

The trick was to maintain a low profile to elude the wrath of the powers-that-were-the choir master and the organist. The aunties and uncles who had also been roped in into the choir were our guardian angels, as it were and, as youngsters, we gratefully slipped beneath the shielding mantle of their powerful and mellifluous voices.

'CRESCENDO!' the choir conductor would bellow, his face like an apoplectic thundercloud. In abject terror we would emit a series of sad squeaks.

Carol rounds was a week-long nocturnal picnic, rattling about in the old, yellow, parish-school bus in the tortuous alleyways of Vizag, all of which looked incredibly magical and mysterious in the moonlight, starlight and the inadequate streetlights of the not-so-cold winter nights in Vizag.

In the dead of night, we visited the homes of pyjama-clad parishioners who looked so very different from the immaculate folk who congregated for mass on Sundays. Our hosts, notwithstanding their nightclothes, would join in with our joyful rendition of the Christmas carols.

We met with the sleepy dogs, cats, parakeets and other miscellaneous furred, feathered and even scaled (eeugh!) housemates. There were cakes and goodies for the carollers at every home and we gorged ourselves like we were starving slum-dog millionaires.

Dawn would inconsiderately sneak up over the horizon as we toured around the last few homes for the night, nevertheless we sang with undiminished gusto, 'Silent night, Holy night, All is calm . . .'

The following night we set off again in the big bus, its sorely deficient suspension doing its darndest to rearrange our vertebral discs. We would be hoarse hunchbacks of Notre Dame by the end of that week.

And Hallelujah! there we were, warbling for all we were worth, during the yuletide run up to Christmas, ringing in the New Year and exultantly hailing Easter morn, not to mention celebrating all the weddings and baptisms that came in between, having practised all year long. Oh, glorious days!

Covid-19 has put paid to much of this activity, and I do miss the crimson-tinted, iron-ore aura of Soldierpet.
